REDWOOD CITY, CA - Neha Patel, the wife of Dharmesh Patel of Pasadena, CA who is accused of deliberately driving a Tesla off a cliff with his family inside, pleaded with prosecutors to drop his attempted murder charges during her courtroom testimony on May 2.

In an emotional statement delivered in a court here, Neha Patel said, the San Francisco Chronicle reported, "We need him in our lives, and it has been over a year and a half since my children, or I have seen or spoken to Dharmesh." She emphasized, "We are not a family without him."



In a survey conducted between July 2022 and January 2023, the Pew Research Center found that two-thirds of Asian American adults actively engage in charitable giving, either in the United States, their Asian ancestral homeland, or both.

Breakdowns by origin showed that majorities across the six largest Asian origin groups in the U.S. expressed involvement in charitable giving within the country. Japanese, Filipino and Indian

adults exhibited particularly high levels of participation, with approximately seven in ten indicating charitable contributions.

Among those born in the U.S., 74% of third- or higher-generation and 65% of second-generation Asian adults told the Pew



they had given to a U.S. charity in the year before the survey. Education and income levels were also influential factors, with individuals holding postgraduate degrees and higher incomes more likely to engage in Contd. on P23

COMMENTARY World Polarizing, India-US Relations Critical

The Middle East is in a situation of flux because of the recent exchange of drone and missile attacks between Iran and Israel, an important visit to Pakistan made by the Iranian President following these events, and the fallout of Israel-Hamas conflict that produced pro-Palestinian demonstrations in the US and elsewhere in the Muslim world.

This is opening up the question as to what impact are the religious divides in the region making on the ideologically delineated Cold War that was already on the horizon involving the US-led West on one hand and the China-Russia axis, on the other.

The old political rivalry between the two strong players in the region, Israel and Iran, took a violent turn when Israel -- opposed to the rule of Bashar Al Assad, the Alawite President of Syria -- made a missile attack on Damascus on April 1 in which Iran's diplomatic mission was hit and seven officers of the Islamic Revolutionary Guards Corp were killed.

Iran retaliated on April 13 by firing missiles at Israel that were mostly shot down by the Iron Dome Defense system of the latter and a few days later on April 18 Israel responded by making a drone attack on Isfahan that reportedly did not cause any significant casualties.

There was an element of restraint on both sides which stemmed from a combination of factors -- Iran weighing in the US support for Israel and Israel sensing the limitations on American backing put by the international criticism of the loss of civilian lives in Gaza at the hands of Israeli Defense Forces.

In fact, in the Joe Biden administration, the White House was contemplating measures to balance its support to Israel with an effort to counter any Islamophobic trends that the Israel-Hamas conflict could produce following the October 7 'terror' attack of Hamas on Israel. The US is also at the same time, having to deal with pro-Palestinian demonstrations held in the country.

Iran and Pakistan, the neigh-

boring Islamic countries -- though inherently prone to the repercussions of the historical Shia-Sunni divide, have maintained a cautious line of peaceful relationship that could even overcome the incidents of exchange of missile attacks between them in January this year. The Sunni Islamic radi-

cal outfit Jaish Al Adl based in Baluchistan intruded into the adjoining Sistan area of Iran whereupon Iran fired missiles on the outfit's base in Baluchistan -- inviting in return, a retaliatory military

somewhat symbolic. In the background of the Israel-Hamas conflict, Iran was getting politically drawn to the China-Russia combine -- it had already extended military help to Russia by way of supply of drones to the latter during the Ukraine-Russia 'war'.

strike from Pakistan that seemed

Pakistan on its part, has historically been opposed to the creation of a Zionist state and maintains no diplomatic relations with Israel even today.

Pakistan has a strong strategic alliance with China but has managed to be on the right side of the US after playing the role of a mediator in the talks between the Taliban and the US at Doha that resulted in the withdrawal of American troops from Afghanistan and the reinstallation of the Taliban Emirate at Kabul in 2021.

Pakistan is also a key member of the Organisation of Islamic Conference and has been extremely close to Saudi Arabia, the Chairman of this block of 57 Islamic countries.

Sunni radicals consider the US and the Shiites as their enemies and would abhor the idea of Pakistan getting close to the US. Pakistan, however, has struck an equation with radical outfits like the Taliban, Al Qaeda, and the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria which are inimical to the US, Saudi Arabia, and the Ayatollah regime of Iran, alike.

For Iran, friendship with Pakistan is strategically gainful for maintaining its hold in the Middle East against its main rival Israel -- it is aware that left to itself Paki-



stan did not harbor any faith-based antipathy towards Iran.

The three-day visit of Iranian President Ebrahim Raisi to Islamabad in the context of the Israel-Hamas conflict -- particularly after the exchange of missile attacks between Iran and Israel -- was of great significance not only for the Middle East but also for the wider geopolitics that is marked by a clear drift towards a new Cold War between the US-led West and the China-Russia axis.

It is interesting how this political polarization at the global level is getting bolstered by the religion-based alignments within the Muslim world in general and the Middle East in particular.

The Iranian President clearly wanted Pakistan's support in its confrontation with Israel even as both Iran and Pakistan were aware of the US opposition to any trade pacts between them. The anti-US character of Shia fundamentalism and the pro-Assad stand of Iran in Syria have pushed Iran closer to Russia and China.

It is interesting, however, that radicalization in the Islamic world is a cause for concern for both the US and Russia.

The US had tried to distinguish between Islamic radical outfits that considered it as their prime enemy and the terrorist groups reared and directed by Pak ISI for use in crossborder terrorism against India but it perhaps realized in the course of time that Pakistan was also giving shelter to Taliban, Al Qaeda and ISIS on its soil.

The US has to understand that multi-prong measures were needed to isolate the 'radicalized' forces by convincing the Islamic world that recourse to Jehad was not needed for solving any political issues. This is a challenge requiring the US and India to closely work together.

The injection of religion into international politics and the advent of faith-based violence in many theatres are posing a great danger to the democratic world order.

The identification of Israel with the US has accentuated the hostility of radical Sunni forces and the Shiite fundamentalists both, against the former. The position of pro-US Arab countries like Saudi Arabia and Egypt could get weakened if the military action of Israel in Gaza was further escalated leading to the destruction of civilian lives there.

India has taken an independent stand both in the Ukraine-Russia military confrontation and the Israel-Hamas conflict, favoring peaceful negotiations that would show an understanding of the security concerns of both Ukraine and Russia and in the case of Palestine uphold a two-state solution.

In the Middle East, advocates of Jehad pushed 'revivalism' to the point of stirring up the historical memory of Kharijites and have carried Shia-Sunni strife to a new level. They should be shunned and those who convincingly worked to establish Islam as a peaceful religion in the region, given discreet support.

While India would stand for all of that, its concern is that Pakistan would independently promote a narrative in the name of peace that there should be a resumption of Indo-Pak talks.

India has to take due notice of the fact that during the visit of Pak Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif to meet Saudi ruler Prince Mohammad bin Salman, their joint statement issued at Mecca on April 7 last, stressed the importance of dialogue between Pakistan and India to resolve their outstanding issues especially the J&K dispute 'to ensure peace and stability in the region'.

Also, on the recent visit of Iran's President to Islamabad, a more elaborate joint statement issued on the occasion expressed that there was a need to resolve the issue of Kashmir through dialogue and peaceful means "based on the will of the people of that region and in accordance with international law".

India should have no difficulty in reminding the world that Pakistan continued to harbor terrorists who attacked India, on its soil and reiterating that 'talks and terrorism could not go together'.

It can be seen, however, that Pakistan always tried to get traction in the Islamic world by projecting Kashmir as a Muslim issue.

India's foreign policy of opting for bilateral or even multilateral friendships that were mutually beneficial for both security and economic development and that served the cause of world peace fits in well in the current geopolitics where ideological and religionbased divisions were producing new alignments and uncertainties.

The natural friendship between the US and India -- the two largest democracies, has to be kept on a strong footing particularly because of the complete convergence the two countries had on the threat from China.

The US proclivity to uphold the cause of Pakistan as a potential ally makes it incumbent for India to reach a deep understanding with Russia and the Central Asian Republics on the danger of 'radicalization' that was getting a fillip because of the duplicitous role of Pakistan in sustaining the Islamic radical outfits on its soil.

India has to independently counter the threat of minority separatism encouraged by anti-India lobbies and safeguard its internal security.

India is doing well in pursuing technological advancement for economic development as well as defense and this should continue to be the raison d'être of its bilateral friendships. All this goes with an assertive role that India as a world power must play on issues of global peace and human advancement. It should also be upfront about countering any outside interference in the domestic matters of democratic India.

Biden Admin's AI Safety Board Includes Indian American Tech Leaders

WASHINGTON, DC - The Department of Homeland Security has established the Artificial Intelligence Safety and Security Board. This board comprises over 20 executives from technology and critical infrastructure sectors, civil rights leaders, academics, and policymakers. The Board will

advise the Secretary of Homeland Security, critical infrastructure stakeholders, private sector entities, and the broader public on ensuring the safe and secure integration of AI technology into the nation's critical infrastructure. Its recommendations will help stakeholders leverage AI technologies more responsibly and prepare for potential disruptions that could impact national security, public health, or safety.

President Biden directed Secretary Alejandro N. Mayorkas to form the Board,



which includes representatives from various sectors such as software and hardware companies, critical infrastructure operators, public officials, civil rights organizations, and academia.

Notable inaugural members include Indian American leaders Satva Nadella of Microsoft, Sundar Pichai of Alphabet, Arvind Krishna of IBM, Shantanu Narayen of Adobe and Arati Prabhakar,

Assistant to the President for Science and Technology. Others include Sam Altman



of AI, Maryland Governor Wes Moore and Maya Wiley of The Leadership Conference on Civil and Human Rights.

The Board's establishment aligns with the DHS Homeland Threat Assessment of 2024, which underscores the threat AIassisted tools pose to economic security and critical infrastructure. It warns of potential cyber-attacks on vital systems like pipelines and railways, with hostile nation-states like China actively developing AI technologies to undermine U.S. cyber defenses.

FDA Investigating Everest, MDH Masalas For Cancer-Causing Pesticide



WASHINGTON, DC - The US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has initiated an investigation into the composition of spice blends produced by two Indian companies amid claims of high levels of cancer-causing pesticides. Earlier this month, Hong Kong took action by suspending the sale of three spice mixes from MDH and one from Everest due to alleged contamination with ethylene oxide, a hazardous substance, the BBC said.

According to Reuters, the FDA is actively reviewing the reports of potential health risks associated with these spice mixes. A spokesperson for the agency stated that they are currently gathering additional information about the situation.

Hindustan Times reported that Everest, one of the companies involved, has asserted the safety of its products for consumption.



In response to the allegations, the company Everest has stated that its spices are exported only after undergoing necessary clearances and approvals from Indian Spice Board laboratories.

On the other hand, MDH has refuted the allegations, describing them as baseless and lacking substantiating evidence. This is not the first time MDH has faced scrutiny. In 2019, batches of its sambar powder were recalled due to salmonella contamination.

The Indian Spice Board, responsible for overseeing spice exports, has also intervened in the matter. It has requested export data from authorities in Hong Kong and Singapore and is collaborating with the companies to investigate the root cause of the alleged quality issues. Inspections have commenced at the respective plants to ensure compliance with regulatory standards.

India's Cipla, Glenmark | SBA-LA Recognizes Minal **Recall Drugs In US**



NEW DELHI, (IANS) - Drug makers Cipla and Glenmark are recalling their products from the US market due to manufacturing issues.

Following the latest Enforcement Report from the US Food and Drug Administration (USFDA), Cipla's subsidiary in New Jersey is recalling 59,244 packs of Ipratropium Bromide and Albuterol Sulfate Inhalation Solution.

The reason for recalling the affected lot of Cipla products is "short fill." FDA said, "Complaints received of less fill volume in repulse and few drops of liquid observed in the intact pouch." This product is manufactured at the Indore SEZ plant of the company in India.

The recalled drug is used to help control the symptoms of lung diseases, including asthma, chronic bronchitis, and emphysema.

As mentioned by the USFDA, Glenmark is recalling 3,264 bottles of Diltiazem Hydrochloride extended-release capsules, which are used to treat high blood pressure.

The US-based arm of the company. Glenmark Pharmaceuticals initiated the nationwide recall of the drug due to "failed dissolution specifications."

Annual Solanki Lecture Focuses On 'Inclusive Innovation'

LONG BEACH, CA – On the evening of April 18, the Yadunandan Center for India Studies at California State University, Long Beach, hosted the twenty-first annual Solanki Lecture, the longest-running endowed lecture series focusing on the history and culture of South Asia and the South Asian diaspora in the US.

This year's distinguished speaker was Shobita Parthasarathy, Professor of Public Policy and Women's and Gender Studies at the University

of Michigan. Dr. Parthasarathy is renowned for her contributions to the field, particularly as the author of two seminal books: "Building Genetic Medicine" and "Patent Politics." These works delve into the ways in which experts shape public discourse and how social for

and how social forces influence the trajectory of science and technology.

Addressing an audience comprising students, faculty, and community members, Professor Parthasarathy provided a captivat-





ing glimpse into her latest research project on "inclusive innovation" efforts in India.

The term "inclusive innovation," prevalent in government, NGO, and corporate spheres, denotes initiatives aimed at leveraging technology to combat poverty and inequality. India serves as a focal point for such endeavors due to its robust science and technology workforce, as well as its innovative approaches to utilizing traditional knowledge for grassroots entrepreneurship. However, despite these efforts, India continues to grapple with significant levels of poverty and discrimination.

Professor Parthasarathy contended that what distinguishes inclusive innovation from previous initiatives is its emphasis on circumventing large-scale infrastructure projects in favor of easily replicable and distributable devices. However, she cautioned that, based on her research into innovation efforts in sanitation and women's health in India, these endeavors often fall short of their intended goals. Through a series of compelling examples, Professor Parthasarathy

illustrated how these projects frequently overlook the socio-cultural contexts in which they are implemented, thereby failing to address the underlying inequalities that persist in Indian society.

declared his family assets in the affidavit submitted to the Election Commission while filing his nomination for the May 13 election.

The founder and CEO of 'UWorld' has left behind Konda Vishweshwar Reddy, the BJP candidate from Chevella Lok Sabha constituency in Telangana, who, earlier in the day, declared family

assets of Rs 4,568 crore.

As per the affidavit, Chandra Sekhar and his wife Koneru Sriratna are both in business. In 2001, during his medical residency, he began writing case-based learning questions for the US Medical Licensing Exam due to the poor quality and high cost of available study resources at the time.

Dependent son Abhinav Pemmasani owns movable assets of Rs 496.27 crore while dependent daughter Sahasra Pemmasani has movable assets of Rs 496.47 crore.

The couple jointly have an investment of Rs.2,402.36 crore in publicly listed companies in

the US. Chandra Sekhar owns five vehicles worth Rs 6.11 crore including two Mercedes Benz, a Tesla Model X, and a Rolls Royce Ghost. He has movable assets of Rs 72 crore while those of his wife are valued at Rs 34.82 crore. They have liabilities of Rs 519 crore each.

In the calendar year 2022, the couple had a joint income of Rs 605.57 crore. The same was Rs 643.42 crore during 2021.

The TDP decided to field Chandra Sekhar from Guntur after sitting MP and business tycoon Galla Jayadev decided not to contest as he wanted to stay away from politics.

Hailing from Burripalem village of Guntur district, Chandra Sekhar did his MBBS from the Osmania Medical College in Hyderabad in 1999. Later, he moved to the US and completed post-graduation. He served as faculty at Johns Hopkins University and practices as a physician. (with IANS inputs)

Gaza: Rep.Thanedar Blasts Vandalism Of Community Center

DETROIT, MI - "As a member of Congress, I am always open to dialogue and debate. Unfortunately, this vandalism of the community center is not an isolated incident, nor is it a productive form of communication. These acts create nothing but fear and division during a time that depends on open conversation and discourse," Rep. Shri Thanedar, said in a statement on May 7, after a community center here, owned and operated by him, was vandalized.

The congressman's face was painted over and the word "racist" was spray-painted on the building. The word "ceasefire" relating to the war in Gaza and a Palestinian flag was also sprayed on the side of the building. "In the past, I have dealt with other unproductive forms of protest. One that turned violent at a holiday party last December and another consisting of individuals demonstrating at my home at 3

in the morning. These incidents ended with people in the hospital and my loved ones feeling unsafe in their own bedrooms. In this case, a place designed to bring our community together was vandalized in a way that seeks to drive it apart," Thanedar said. Thanedar has been a target after he came out in support of Israel in the aftermath of Hamas' brutal attacks last October. Since then he has called for all hostages on both sides to be released and a cease-fire to be called.

"War never solves any problems," Thanedar told the Detroit Free Press, and believes Hamas needs to be dismantled to a point where it is incapable of repeating such violence. "I have never shied away from talking about it," he added. "(But) such vandalism, creating such fear among my supporters ... isn't going to bring sympathy to their cause." The vandalized building is used for community events, seminars, and roundtable discussions.

Indian Americans Caution Rutgers Against Display Of 'Flag Of Kashmir'



WASHINGTON, DC (IANS) - Indian Americans are calling upon a US university not to implement a portion of one

> of the demands it conceded to protesting students to display on campus the flags of "occupied people", which listed Kashmiris along with Palestinians and the Kurds.

"This is a dangerous territory for Rutgers to get involved (sic)," Thomas Abraham, chairman of the Global Organization of People of Indian Origin (GOPIO), wrote in a letter to Jonathan Holloway President, Rutgers University-New Brunswick in New

Jersey state.

"By even considering this demand, you are questioning the integrity of India. Kashmir is very much a part of India. There is no separate flag for Kashmir. Kashmir residents are not displaced people. In fact, the displaced people are the Hindu minorities who had to leave Kashmir because of violence against them. If Rutgers displays such a flag of Kashmir, that will be the beginning of more sit-ins by students who are opposed to such flags," Abraham wrote.

The university has not implemented this demand.

"The Office of the Chancellor will take stock of flags that are displayed across Rutgers- New Brunswick campus and ensure appropriate representation of students enrolled in academic and other spaces," Chancellor Francine Conway wrote in a three-page letter responding to the protesting students.

The students had demanded, as specified in her letter, "display the flags of occupied peoples — including but not limited to Palestinians, Kurds, and Kashmiris — in all areas displaying international flags across the Rutgers campuses".

Students were protesting the Israeli war in Gaza as students at many universities across the country had put forth 10 demands.

The top demand, which has been common to protesters in all other universities, was divestment from companies doing business with Israel or supporting its war effort and cutting links with Israel.

The chancellor said the university is reviewing these links and will discuss the findings with the students.

In A Contentious Race, Bhavini Patel Loses Primary In PA

Rep. Swalwell Concerned About India Targeting Sikhs In The US

WASHINGTON, D.C. – In what he called "transnational repression," Representative Eric Swalwell of California's 14th District has voiced concerns over what he perceives as targeted attacks against the Sikh community in the United States, allegedly orchestrated by the Indian government.

In a statement, Swalwell said the Indian government was launching a campaign aimed at

intimidating and suppressing members of the Sikh community residing in the United States and Canada. His statement comes in the wake of more revelations in the media on the alleged plot to kill a Khalistani terrorist on US soil by the Indian government.

Swalwell's assertions are grounded in what he describes as "credible evidence," which prompted the FBI to issue alerts to individuals believed to be at risk. The Congressman emphasized the gravity of the situation, stressing that such actions not only contravene American law but also strain the longstanding relationship between the world's oldest and largest democracies.



The Congressman, who represents one of the largest Sikh communities in

the nation, expressed gratitude towards law enforcement, particularly the FBI, for their swift response in alerting constituents to potential threats. He also commended the Biden Administration for prioritizing the safety of vulnerable communities and urged continued vigilance in monitoring and addressing the alleged threats.

However, Swalwell asserted that more com-


WASHINGTON, DC – Nikki Haley, who was beaten back by Donald Trump for the Republican presidential nomination has landed a new job at the Hudson Institute.

desire to work after college and settle down here. They are unlikely to participate in protests or take part in an action that pits them against the law, which could jeopardize their future.

Protests have spread across US colleges and universities against Israel's ongoing war in Gaza, with students demanding an end to US support for Israel and, as in the case of Columbia University, cutting with businesses and other entities with investments in Israel.

These protests have turned violent in many instances with students taking over parts of the university building as they did in Columbia. Police have arrested scores of students and are breaking up their encampments, as their tents pitched around the campuses are being called.

College authorities and law enforcement agencies have blamed some of the violence on outsiders joining student protestors. New York police found "professional agitators" among protestors at Columbia. President Joe Biden addressed the violence in a speech from the White House saying that the freedom to protest must be accompanied by respect for the law. "Violent protest is not protected, peaceful protest is," he said.

"It's against the law if violence occurs. Vandalism, trespassing, breaking windows, shutting down campuses, forcing the cancellation of classes and graduations. None of this is a peaceful protest. Threatening people, intimidating people, instilling fear in people is not peaceful protest. It's against the law. Dissent is essential to democracy. But dissent must never lead to disorder, or to denying the rights of others so students can finish the semester and their college education," the President said.

The US President also appealed for an end to anti-semitism and Islamophobia or discrimination against supporters of Palestine.

"There should be no place on any campus, no place in America, for anti-Semitism, or threats of violence against Jewish students. There is no place for hate speech or violence of any kind, whether it's anti-semitism, Islamophobia, or discrimination against Arab-Americans or Palestinian Americans. It's simply wrong. There's no place for racism in America. It's all wrong," he said.

Additionally, the Pew survey shed light on charitable giving in Asian "ancestral homelands," with one in five Asian adults in the U.S. reporting involvement in charitable activities in their country of origin.

About a third of Indian American adults (31%) and about a quarter of Vietnamese American adults (24%) say they have given to a charity in their Asian origin country. One in ten Chinese adults and 6% of Japanese adults say the same.

Individuals' perceptions of their ancestral homeland influenced their likelihood of engaging in charitable giving. Those with a favorable view of their ancestral homeland were more inclined to donate to charitable organizations there compared to those with neutral or unfavorable opinions.

Religion also played a role in charitable giving behaviors, with Asian Hindus and Muslims exhibiting higher rates of engagement in charitable activities in their Asian ancestral homelands compared to the religiously unaffiliated Asian Americans' charitable giving in their Asian country of origin also varies by how important religion is in their lives. The Pew Survey showed:

29% of those who say religion is very important have given to a charity in their Asian origin country in the 12 months before the survey.

12% of those who say religion is not too or not at all important in their life have done the same.

Indian Sailors Remain On Ship That Brought Down Baltimore Bridge

BALTIMORE, MD (IANS) -They would have been in Colombo in Sri Lanka, their destination, a couple of days ago, and would have been on their way home. But they remain on a cargo ship off the coast of the port city of Baltimore.

The 20 Indian members of the crew of Dali remain on board the vessel 35 days after the container ship brought down a bridge in Baltimore on March 26 in an early morning maritime accident that claimed the lives of six men who were working on the bridge at the time. A member of the crew who was injured received treatment on shore and returned to the ship the day after.

Fluent Cargo, a company that says it plans freight routes for clients across land, air, and sea, says a container ship would take about 33 days and 21 hours to reach Colombo from Baltimore. If everything goes according to schedule, they might have added.

Dali hit a pillar of the Key Scott Bridge, a 50-year-old structure that serves thousands of motorists every day, in circumstances that are being investigated by multiple US agencies.

The collision brought the bridge and blocked the passage of all cargo ships waiting to be on their way after Dali.

The crew are on the ship which is the scene of investigation by the US authorities.

The FBI has launched a criminal inquiry into the incident apart from separate probes underway by the National Transportation Safety Board and the Coast Guard's Marine Board of Investigation.

The bridge collapse received nationwide attention and US President Joe Biden has promised all possible help in the construction of the bridge and visited the site.

Jim Lawrence, a spokesperson for the Dali owner Grace Ocean Private Ltd., said the Indian crew members confirmed their presence on board now for 33 days.



"Still on board, in good spirits," he added.

They are frequently represented by representatives of the company and the Indian embassy and by the Seamen's Church Institute, which serves mariners in education, legal advocacy, and pastoral guidance.

The crew "routinely have catered meals and desserts delivered to the ship", Lawrence said, adding, "In addition to performing normal duties on board the ship, they are also assisting with the investigations and with the ongoing salvage work."

A request to interview the crew or get a written statement from

any of them was turned down "out of respect for the investigation".

The Indian embassy in Washington D.C. declined a request for the names of the stranded sailors and

had not responded till the filing of this report to a request for information about the well-being of the Indian sailors: if they could go off the ship, whether they have US permission to go on the mainland, and, finally, how often was the embassy or the relevant consulate checking on the crew.

Experts have said the sailors could remain on the ship for a few more weeks and or months. And when they are allowed to leave, the junior sailors will be prioritized. The senior members were in for a long stay on the ship which is standing still in the waters

as engineers cut away parts of the collapsed bridge lying across its bow, the front part.

Authorities expect to get the ship afloat again by May 10 and dock it.

It will remain there for the duration of the investigations.

The owners have said the crew has received counseling from workplace mental health specialists with experience in the maritime industry.

A dedicated team that included clinical psychologists had worked round-the-clock in support of the crew in the immediate aftermath of the incident "in the form of regular, individual, and confidential counseling". These resources were also on offer to the families of the crew.

The company had allowed the crew members unlimited use of the ship's satellite communications system to stay in contact with their families.

Dali was constructed by South Korea's Hyundai Heavy Industries and was launched in late 2014. It's owned by Grace Ocean Private Ltd, flies a Singapore flag, and runs on diesel.

Probe Ongoing: Trudeau After Nijjar Killing Arrests | CA Police Confirm Goldy Brar

TORONTO, (ANI) - Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau said on May 5 that the investigation into the killing of India-designated terrorist Hardeep Singh Nijjar is "not limited" to the arrest of three Indian nationals and is ongoing. Trudeau said that it is important because "Canada is a rule-of-law country."

The Canada PM's remarks came days after three Indian nationals were arrested for their involvement in the killing of Nijjar. Police on May 4 released photographs of

all three persons amid an ongoing probe into the alleged connections of the Indian government.

Speaking at the Sikh Foundation of Canada's Centennial Gala event held at the Royal Ontario Museum on May 5, Trudeau highlighted Canada's status as a rule-of-law country with a robust and independent justice system. "This is important because Canada is a rule-of-law country with a strong and independent justice system, as well as a fundamental commitment to protecting all its citizens. I know that many Canadians, particularly members of the Sikh community, are feeling uneasy and perhaps even frightened right now."



India, still bristling at the public statements of Trudeau, had External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar respond. He said Canada has been issuing visas to people with links to organized crime despite warnings from New Delhi. Jaishankar said some people in Canada, with 'pro-Pakistan leanings', have organized themselves politically and taken the shape of an influential political lobby. He said he saw reports that three people have been arrested, and the Canadian police have conducted "some investigation."

Along with photographs of the three accused, the Canadian police have also released the photographs of the car believed to have been used by the suspects in the time leading up to the homicide, in and around the Surrey area.

Addressing reporters at a news conference, RCMP Assistant Commissioner David Teboul, who leads the Federal Policing Program in the Pacific Region, said, "Three suspects have been arrested and charged for their alleged involvement in the killing of Nijjar.... We are not able to make any comments on the nature of evidence... Nor can we speak behind the motive of murder of Nijjar... However, I will say this matter is very much under active investigation," he said.

Hardeep Singh Nijjar was designated a terrorist by India's National Investigation Agency in 2020.

Not Killed In Fresno Shootout

FRESNO, CA (IANS) -Fresno police on May 1 denied reports that one of the two persons attacked in a shooting incident was Canada-based gangster Goldy Brar. "If you are inquiring because of the online chatter claiming that the shooting victim is 'Goldy Brar', we can confirm that this is not true," Lieutenant William J. Dooley said.

"We have received inquiries from around the world this morning because of misinformation being spread on social media and online news agencies. We are not sure who started this rumor, but it

caught on and spread like wildfire. But again, it isn't true. The victim is not Goldy."

The police have not yet identified the two persons who were attacked, one of whom died at a hospital later. The other person was released from the hospital after treatment.

They two were attacked at Fairmont and Holt Avenue in the northwestern part of Fresno after a fight in the evening of May 1, the police said earlier.

The younger of the two, said to be in his 30s, was shot in the upper body. He was taken to the hospital



in critical condition where he died later. The other man was hit in the lower part of the body and was released from the hospital after treatment.

But reports of the shooting spread like wildfire in India, claiming the deceased was gangster Goldy Brar.

The US media was cited as a source, but the details were either sketchy or wrong.

One report said the man was shot outside the Fairmont Hotel. Some reports even claimed that rival gang leaders had claimed responsibility for the killing.

WASHINGTON, DC - H-1B workers are not only paid-they receive wages in the top 10 percent of wage earners in the United States. As importantly, although they face more obstacles to changing jobs, H-1B workers are not tied to a single employer and they change jobs regularly, a Cato Institute report said.

In fact, H-1B workers are leaving their initial H-1B employers more than ever, it said. The government has made it easier to switch H-1B jobs by giving them a sixty-day grace period to find a new job after losing a job.

Some of the salient points in the report: -From fiscal year 2005 to 2023, H-1B workers changed jobs over 1 million times. -H-1B job shifting is more common than H-1B workers starting H-1B employment for

however, still not treated equally in the labor market. "New H-1B employers must pay hefty fees to poach them, and the shortage of green cards for Indian workers can wrongly make those workers feel that they have to stick with their existing employer to complete that process. The best solution would be to make the conversion to a green card automatic rather than requiring a renewal after three years. The sixty-day grace period to find a new job is still not long enough to give many workers the confidence to simply quit a problematic job without a new one already lined up," it said.

Citing the Pew Research Center, the report said that the "existence of widespread H-1B job shifting further refutes the idea that H-1B workers are "indentured" servants."

Vinay Kwatra, In The Running To Become Envoy, Meets Officials In Washington



WASHINGTON, DC (IANS) - Indian Foreign Secretary Vinay Kwatra on April 12 concluded a two-day visit to Washington D.C. during which he held discussions with his counterparts at the US State Department and the National Security Council.

The Indian embassy said Kwatra's meetings were in "keeping with the tradition of regular high-level exchanges between the two countries and provided an opportunity to further advance our growing and futureoriented partnership".

Among officials he met were Richard Verma, the US Deputy Secretary of State, which is the highest position held by an Indian-American at the State Department; and Kurt Campbell, recently appointed the US Deputy Secretary of State, who is also the Biden administration's czar on the Indo-Pacific and the Quad - a group of Indo-Pacific countries, India, the US, Japan and Australia.

Though not related to the visit, according to reports Kwatra is also one of the two frontrunners in the race for the ambassadorship to the US, which is currently vacant.

The other contender is Vikram Misri, India's Deputy National Security Adviser.

Documentaries Featuring Ravish Kumar, Black Kites Protection Earn Peabody Noms

LOS ANGELES, CA – Two Indian documentaries, Vinay Shukla's "While We Watched" and Shaunak Sen's "All That Breathes," have been nominated for the prestigious Peabody Awards.

On April 23, jurors unveiled a list of 41 contenders spanning Documentary, News,

Public Service, and Radio/Podcast categories. Among them are Shukla's film, which delves into the life of former NDTV anchor Ravish Kumar, and Sen's work, an Oscarnominated exploration of two Muslim brothers dedicated to safeguarding black kites.

Shukla's documentary has received worldwide acclaim even while it has not generated support in India. It offers a portrayal of In-



dia's bleak media landscape and has drawn accolades at prestigious film festivals

like Busan and Toronto. Peabody said it was a "timely depiction of a newsroom in crisis." The film follows Kumar as he navigates a deluge of fake news, plummeting ratings, and ensuing cutbacks while striving to uphold fact-based reporting.

Sen's "All That Breathes," hailed for its portrayal of two brothers safeguarding black kites in New Delhi amid environmental and social upheaval, is also vying for a Peabody Award. The film, which has scooped over 17 international accolades, including the top documentary award at Cannes, has been acquired by HBO and is accessible on various online platforms.

The ceremony is slated for June 9 in Los Angeles. These nominations follows Rintu Thomas and Sushmit Ghosh's 2023 Peabody win for "Writing With Fire," marking a historic achievement as the first Indian filmmakers to clinch the award.
